ABOUT THIS FILM:

What can we learn from those who have turned their psychological crisis into a positive transformative experience? CRAZYWISE follows two young Americans who achieved exactly that: Adam, 27, & Ekhaya, 32.

While documenting indigenous cultures, photographer and filmmaker Phil Borges often saw these cultures identify "psychotic" symptoms as an indicator of shamanic potential.

CRAZYWISE doesn't aim to over-romanticize indigenous wisdom, or completely condemn Western treatment. However, indigenous peoples' acceptance of nonordinary states of consciousness, along with rituals and metaphors that form deep connections to nature, to each other, and to ancestors, is something we can learn from.
